Appendix 3: Review of Landscape Actions from 2006 Conservation & Management Plan

This document is a review of the recommended actions in Bureau Veritas' report in the Port Sunlight Conservation & Management Plan (2006). The review notes any suggested actions in Bureau Veritas' report and if they were completed, partially completed or have not yet been completed. For any outstanding works the review will explain why these works have not yet commenced and suggest next steps to complete the action (if applicable), including ongoing projects within Port Sunlight Village Trust. If applicable, the 'next steps' will feature in the Action Plan of the new Conservation Management Plan (CMP).
